Dear Friends,

As a board member over the last ten years, it has truly been my honor and indeed a pleasure to serve as President of Alzheimer's Services of the Capital Area the past two years. The dedicated Board of Directors and talented staff are completely committed to providing the best care and services to our clients and their families. I am very proud and excited to share some of our successes over the last year.

The 2017 year was truly exceptional for the organization. Charlie's Place celebrated its 10th Anniversary and a second Charlie's Place opened in Gonzales. The grand opening celebration of Charlie's Place: The Jo Lamar Respite and Activity Center in April welcomed the Ascension community. Charlie's Place carries the name "Charlie" in honor of three Charlie's – Charlie Lamar, Charlie Valluzzo, and the late Charlie Spera – who have significantly impacted the growth and success of the organization. Funding for the Gonzales center was provided by Charlie and Carole Lamar and Bill and Mary Lee Dixon through the Challenge Grant from the Charles and Josephine Lamar Memorial Fund and the Lamar Dixon Fund. Matching funds were contributed by several funders listed on page 14. The center housed in The ARC of East Ascension's facility on S. Purpera Road began serving clients two days each week with the intention of expanding as enrollment grows.

Our community was shaken by the flood of 2016 and we saw more families affected seeking help in 2017 as they rebuilt their homes and lives; those caring for a loved one with Alzheimer's met additional challenges. We assisted families with additional disaster funding and extended services at Charlie's Place so caregivers could address additional needs. The Young Women's Christian Organization donated additional funds specifically to assist those affected by the flood.

We welcomed Teepa Snow back as the keynote speaker for the Education Conference. Many regular participants requested we bring her back, and the popular author and expert on dementia care didn't disappoint the audience. Snow walked among attendees interacting with them to illustrate her points and demonstrate the characteristics caregivers see and experience while caring for loved ones.

Our Sustainability Method of evaluation helped to identify areas the organization can grow and devote resources to meet additional needs. With that in mind, program and services were tweaked, revised and promoted resulting in increases in nearly every category. Monthly Lunch-N-Learn programs continued to be held at the Goodwood Library allowing for additional participation. Several months' programs reached capacity at 65 participants. Financial Literacy: Making Sense of Cents enrollment nearly tripled and 25 participants took advantage of the one-on-one sessions with either a financial advisor or an attorney for professional advice and guidance. Support group attendance increased by over 100 participants; sites were assessed and some were eliminated while other sites were added.

Director of Services Dana Territo and Executive Director Barbara Auten co-presented on "A Successful Social Model Respite Center" at the Aging Society's International Conference in March. Neila Donovan, PhD., from the LSU's Life Course and Aging College and Katherine Schillings Verberne were also co-presenters.

Dr. Donovan conducted and completed a study with Charlie's Place clients on the Music and Memory program. The study involved measuring the cognition and socialization of clients following a session of listening to a personal playlist of music. The results showed a significant increase in client verbiage and quality of language. Donovan's graduate students participated in the project by compiling and downloading the playlists followed by the observation of interaction, and were invited to enter their poster in the Aging Society Conference. They received honors for their poster entry in LSU's Life Course and Aging College.

The 2017 budget was developed conservatively following the flood of 2016. Our donors were more generous than ever and our fundraising efforts continued to be successful. The Huey and Angelina Wilson Foundation and The Coates Challenge gifts inspired 20 new Rosemary Society members while several more members renewed their pledges at the annual Memories in the Making event. Annual Giving and Memorial gifts increased also. The Walk/Run to Remember income remained nearly the same as 2016, but there was an increase in teams. A trending decline in funds raised was shared when comparing information with other nonprofits in the area that hold Walk events. New efforts are being implemented to continue to grow the event and create even more awareness. The organization received a sizable payment from the BP Settlement that was invested in the organization's Endowment fund and cash reserves. The funds allow the organization to advance with the security of a six-month cash reserve while continuing to grow the Endowment to secure the future of the organization.

Again, I wish to express my sincere appreciation to everyone involved in the organization and look forward to our continued success.

#### IN 2017, ALZHEIMER'S SERVICES...

- Celebrated the 10-year anniversary of Charlie's Place Activity & Respite Center in Baton Rouge.
- Held the 24th Annual Education Conference on March 29, 2017, in the Belle of Baton Rouge Atrium hosting world-renowned keynote speaker Teepa L. Snow, MS, OTR/L, FAOTA.
- Opened Charlie's Place Jo Lamar Activity & Respite Center in Gonzales in April 2017.
- Joined the Ascension Parish Chamber of Commerce.
- Completed a study facilitated by an LSU Communication Disorders graduate class on "Music and Memory" with clients at Charlie's Place in Baton Rouge to determine how music can improve memory and communication.
- Increased the Rosemary Society to 208 members, who contribute \$1,000 or more dollars per year for 5 years, to ensure the sustainability of the programs and services Alzheimer's Services offers.
- Held the 23rd Annual Walk/Run to Remember on October 21, 2017. LSU Gymnastics Coach, D-D Breaux, served as the Walk/Run to Remember Honorary Chair.
- Hosted 163 service learning students at Charlie's Place Activity and Respite Center in Baton Rouge from 3 different higher education institutions.
- Distributed Recollection Collection Activity Kits to 32 nursing homes and trained 404 employees in person-centered care as a part of the statewide effort to reduce the use of antipsychotic drugs in nursing homes.
- Hosted the 3rd Annual Day of Memories at Perkins Rowe to acknowledge the month of November as Alzheimer's Disease Awareness Month.



#### CHARLENE HANCHEY FORMER CAREGIVER AND AMBASSADOR

"Charlie's Place was an absolute God-send... There are no comparisons; it's unbelievable," Charlene said. "Charlie's Place gave me respite and Randy enjoyed painting birdhouses and going on field trips to visit horses."

Charlene and Randy met at the University of Louisiana at Lafayette, married in 1961 and now have three sons. Several years after they were married they lived in New Orleans, where Randy received his Master's degree from Tulane, before he was offered a scholarship at Stanford University to obtain a post-graduate degree. Charlene and Randy moved from there to Washington, D. C. where they lived for over 20 years. While there, he spent much of his time traveling around the world speaking about civil engineering. Once they had grandchildren, Randy and Charlene moved to Vicksburg, MS, to be near their family. That is when Randy took on the role as the Chief Engineer for the Army Corp of Engineers for the whole Mississippi River.

When he retired from the Army Corp of Eningeers after 37 years, Randy was asked to join the Department of



Natural Resources in Baton Rouge. One day in December 2007, he came home from work one day and told Charlene he 'quit'. Charlene asked, "Quit what?" Randy explained he had turned in his resignation that day. When she questioned why, Randy told her that he was at the Capitol listening to colleagues talking but he couldn't make sense of what they were saying. Randy told Charlene he "couldn't do any work anymore." After his retirement, Charlene felt like Randy was doing 'pretty good'. Randy meticulously measured and re-arranged the kitchen in their home the following January. He was enjoying retirement and playing golf four days a week once the kitchen updates were complete. Then several months later, Charlene knew something was truly wrong when Randy got lost coming home from playing golf one day. Charlene took Randy to the doctor for testing after the incident occurred.

A staff person at Pennington Biomedical Center suggested Randy might enjoy the program at Charlie's Place and he did. "Charlie's Place gave Randy an outlet in so many ways," Charlene said. "He felt comfortable and there was something from the very beginning; Randy just always had a bond with Charlie's Place and other clients."

#### MARY SPERA DONOR AND AMBASSADOR

Mary has been a friend of Alzheimer's Services of the Capital Area for many years. Her son, the late Charles "Charlie" Spera, served on the Alzheimer's Services Board of Directors. Mary and her husband, Joseph, were married for 73 years before his death in 2015. Joseph "Joe" worked for Sears while Mary was a fashion buyer for a local store in Alexandria, LA. They had two sons, Edward and Charlie.

When Mary's son Edward, also known as "Eddie," was diagnosed with younger-onset Alzheimer's at age 40, Mary and Joseph were incredibly involved in helping Eddie's wife with his care. Around the same time, their son Charlie was recognized as the Top Ranked New York Life Insurance Agent of the company's approximately 10,000 insurance agents. Her sons faced some of the lowest lows and highest highs in life around the same time – and their parents were right there for both of them all along the way.


Through his leadership on the board of directors, Charlie Spera sought to ensure the continuation of Alzheimer's Services' programs and services into the future. In memory of his brother, Eddie, Charlie set aside an insurance policy and Alzheimer's

Services' received the proceeds from his generous bequest. This cornerstone gift became the foundation of the Endowment Fund. The endowment was created also in honor of Charlie Valluzzo, Spera's very good friend, whose commitment and service to the Alzheimer's Services have made an enormous impact on the greater Baton Rouge community.

"The reason I stay involved in Alzheimer's Services is because I believe in it. I also want to keep Charlie's name and efforts alive," Mary said.

Mary went on to mention that she began noticing her husband, Joe, experiencing symptoms of dementia. "Though Joe didn't come to Charlie's Place," Mary explained, "Alzheimer's Services provided me with information and support to help me care for Joe at home."

"I wish everyone would feel the way I do about the importance of having Alzheimer's Services in our community," Mary said. "I know first-hand the need we have. The patient is scared and doesn't always understand what's happening, so it's important to prepare the caregiver."



#### JOHN SNOW

#### BOARD MEMBER, VOLUNTEER, DONOR AND AMBASSADOR

Originally from Columbia, SC, John moved to Baton Rouge when he was 10-years-old after his father was transferred by his company, Bellsouth. Twenty-two years later and John is now entrenched in the Baton Rouge community and has built a career in consulting. Emergent Method, his company, focuses on management consulting in the strategy and problem-solving space.

John's grandfather suffered from dementia and it was difficult for him and his family to watch as the disease progressed. As John's grandfather's health declined, his grandfather and grandmother moved into an assisted living community. It was a wonderful place, but John sees now that his grandfather lacked the structured, stimulating environment and resources he knows are available now at Alzheimer's Services and Charlie's Place Activity and Respite Centers.

It was shortly after John's grandfather's passing when he was introduced to Alzheimer's Services, and began collaborating with the staff to re-envision and recreate the organization's community needs assessment. Though he didn't know much about Alzheimer's Services at first, John wanted to help in whatever way he could to honor the life of his grandfather.



John has served on the Board of Directors of Alzheimer's Services for 6 years. John said, "I have developed such an appreciation for this organization the more I get involved. The passion of the people who work for this organization and the passion of those on the board, who have dedicated so much of their time and resources in this community, make me wish a place like this existed in South Carolina."

"We are increasingly going to have to struggle and deal with this disease in many unfortunate ways – whether it's parents or grandparents being diagnosed with younger-onset," John said. "I want to be an ambassador for the organization by helping to ensure the people of my generation and frankly, even younger, have an understanding of what this organization is, what it does, how to connect and get involved, how to support it, and then to know that it's a resource if and when the time comes."

John's wish: "What I want people to know about Alzheimer's Services is the tremendous impact that it has in this community."
